

# Use Before Coordinating Conjunctions

When linking two independent clauses with a coordinating conjunction (FANBOYS: **for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so**), insert a comma.

## Critical Vocabulary

- **Conjunction:** A word that connects clauses, sentences, or words.
- **Clause:** A group of words containing a subject and a predicate. It can be independent (a complete sentence) or dependent (needs an independent clause).

## Clauses

**Independent Clauses:** Complete sentences that express a full thought. They contain a subject and a verb, and they can stand alone.

- *Example:* "She ran to the store."

**Dependent Clauses:** Contain a subject and a verb but do not express a complete thought. They can't stand alone and need an independent clause to make sense.

- *Example:* "Because she was late."

## Steps to Identify Clauses

1. **Look for the subject.** (*Who is the sentence about?*)
2. **Identify the predicate.** (*What is happening in the sentence?*)
3. **Confirm independence.** (*Does it make sense on its own?*)

## Coordinating Conjunctions (FANBOYS)

### For

- *Purpose:* Explains reason or purpose.
- *Example:* "I'll bring my umbrella, for it looks like rain."

### And

- *Purpose:* Adds one thing to another.
- *Example:* "We ordered burgers, fries, and a shake."

### Or

- *Purpose:* Presents choices or alternatives.
- *Example:* "Would you like tea, or would you prefer coffee?"

## Nor

- *Purpose*: Connects two negatives to offer another option.
- *Example*: “She didn't like the movie, nor did she enjoy the book.”

## But

- *Purpose*: Shows contrast or contradiction.
- *Example*: “I wanted to stay, but I was too tired.”

## Yet

- *Purpose*: Introduces a contrasting idea that follows logically.
- *Example*: “She is small, yet she is mighty.”

## So

- *Purpose*: Indicates effect, result, or consequence.
- *Example*: “It was late, so I went home.”

## Big Point

The presence of a coordinating conjunction (FANBOYS) does not mean that there has to be a comma. Both sides of the comma must be independent clauses (complete sentences).
